## 2. Confirmation that the site is subject to serious industrial breakdown regulations and that the site's operator reported its status to proper authorities and provided a breakdown prevention program.

Pursuant to the Regulation of the Minister of Development of 29 January 2016, Stock Polska plant, due to large volumes of hazardous substances stored on the premises, was classified as a plant posing an increased risk of a serious industrial breakdown.

The plant is subject to legislation designed to prevent industrial breakdowns. Pursuant to Articles 250 and 251 of the Environmental Protection Law (Journal of Laws of 2016, item 672, as amended), the plant's status was reported to appropriate authorities – The National Fire Service and The Regional Environmental Protection Inspectorate – and a breakdown prevention program was submitted to them.

## 3. Plant activities outline

The Stock Polska plant in Lublin manufactures alcoholic beverages, namely clear and flavoured vodkas.

#### 4. Properties of stored hazardous substances, their names, categories and identified hazards.

The hazardous substance that determined the site's classification as a plant posing an increased risk of a serious industrial breakdown is ethyl alcohol (ethanol).

#### 5. Measures used to warn the local population and to instruct them in proper response in the event of an industrial breakdown.

In the event of a breakdown or in circumstances indicating such a possibility, the local population shall be warned by means of:

- public address systems installed on police, fire brigade and city services vehicles,
- local radio stations,
- local TV stations.

**Should an industrial breakdown occur,**

a) personnel who are in the vicinity of the breakdown must:

- evacuate the hazard area moving perpendicular to the wind direction,
- alert other personnel to the hazard,
- provide adequate care and protection for minors, seniors and people with disabilities,
- comply with instructions issued by rescue services.

b) personnel who are in closed rooms and spaces must:

- remain inside these rooms or spaces until the alarm has been called off,
- tune in the radios/TV sets to the frequency of local stations,
- shut the doors, windows and vents tightly,
- disable air flows, fans and mechanical ventilation systems components,
- wait for the alarm to be called off.
